

Climbing Guinea Flower

Hibbertia scandens

What is it?

Hibbertia scandens is a vigorous climber with thick fleshy stems trailing for up to 3m, and it flowers most of the year. It has elliptical leaves up to 9cm in length with a dark shiny upper surface and hairy underneath. Golden yellow 5-petaled flowers up to 7cm in length last only a day or two, but occur consistently throughout the year. It grows best in full-sun with good drainage and is suitable as a screening climber or as a ground-covering scrambler amongst established plants.



Where do they occur?

Due to its tolerance of a wide range of climates, *Hibbertia scandens* is found Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria in all non-arid areas, including sand dunes, mountainous areas prone to frost and wooded areas.
